From the Administrator's Desk: Mr David Murray

The apostle Paul issued a warning to believers, "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths" (2 Tim. 4:3-4).

Truth is key in this passage. Those who have 'itching ears' turn away from the truth and wander into myths. Their hearts will not allow them to endure sound teaching; instead they surround themselves with teachers who speak to their passions and they become entangled in false doctrines. In short, scriptural truth and worldly passions do not coincide.

On the other hand, those that belong to Christ discern what is true. They hunger for the Word of God, and when that hunger is satiated, there is fullness of life and strength of purpose. Believers have no need of cheap ploys because, "we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God" (2 Cor. 4:2). Our calling is to stand guard and point to the living Word. It is a precious jewel—brilliant, multifaceted, and resplendent with glory. May we hold it up high!

Additionally, Christians are to be marked by love and unity. Not a flippant, tolerance-focused unconcern for the lives of others (as sometimes espoused these days), but a rich, agonizing, and at times heart wrenching ocean of charity married with Truth. Believers should have nothing to do with disunity, worldly passions, mocking or scoffing as these are the weapons of the adversary. Our weapon is the double-edge sword of Truth, one that cuts both ways and that is "able to discern the thoughts and the intentions of the heart" (Heb. 4:12b).

In short, we are disarmed without the Word of Truth. We need continual reminders that the purest and most genuine form of love comes from Him who has shown it to us. The fruit of the Spirit, "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control," all purify and subdue the heart for unity in Christ.

In reading this text, we recognized our need to recount our founding stories and to commemorate how we have seen God work in the inception and development of the school. This year, students who took part of the wax museum, most in Revolutionary War costume, were recorded recounting ordinary jobs held by citizens during this time and the histories of well-known revolutionary heroes such as George Washington, Paul Revere, Nathan Hale, as well as lesser known patriots, young men and women who worked as spies, runners, poets and songwriters, all who played an important role in bringing about our independence. Not only players who aided the American cause were represented, however; the wife of Benedict Arnold, also a traitor, told the story of her exploits during that harrowing time period in our history.
