




Honor of Graduating Seniors, May 16th

Classroom Spotlight

Pre-Algebra (Mr. Day)

While at Trinity Academy, we are not slaves to the textbook, but it is nice to look back and see all the wonderful material that the students have mastered over the course of the year. Our advanced pre-algebra students range from 6th through 8th grade, and they are developing skills in using formulas, classifying and calculating areas of polygons, and performing basic trigonometric functions. The students are now one chapter away from completing a rigorous pre-algebra course and are ready to move on to full algebra. They have been greatly assisted in their mathematics education by Mrs. Spangler's wonderful "Harmony in Math" course and their mental math is really impressive. Every so often, we play "Around the World" where the students compete against each other to solve problems such as, "What is 15% of 40?" in their heads. They can do this type of problem in seconds. As Mr. Miller likes to say, "God's language for the universe is math" (approximate quote). These students are learning that language well so they can better understand God's wonderful creation.

Third Grade (Mrs. Bean)

The third grade class spent January preparing for the Science Fair. Our project was to construct balloon powered vehicles, and we had so much fun building them and trying them out. Most school days, we had some trial runs and we learned a lot about what would and wouldn't work well. We really enjoyed sharing our vehicles at the science fair and showing the power of the balloon. Additionally, Concentrated Studies and the Wax Museum were so exciting for the 3rd grade to look forward to. This is the first year they were able to take part in the Wax Museum. Since we were studying the Ancients, they were each assigned a Bible character to present. They put a lot of time and effort into preparing for their Wax Museum performance. They began early in February researching and taking notes. Then they prepared a sentence outline, rough draft, and final



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copy of their speeches by the end of February. They worked hard during March memorizing their speeches and preparing costumes and props.

Health (Mr. Adams)

We have finished our first ever 12th grade Health class with our first ever seniors, Gabriel Watkins and Brody Runyan. Recently, they both gave strong presentations on two very different mental illnesses. Gabe gave an informative presentation on the ever prevalent attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). Brody also gave a thoughtful presentation on the often misunderstood illness of Schizophrenia. Both of them did a great job and put in a lot of effort.
